# With Love and Faith, We Achieve Together...

Father's Musings As we approach the end of that part of Saint Luke's Gospel before the Passion narratives, and approach the end of the

Church's year, our thoughts are turned towards the end of time and the Second Coming of the Lord – this will lead us into Advent in two weeks time. Saint Luke's message is very distinctive: the Lord will come, but there is a lot to be lived through first. The coming of the Lord is not going to be a "quick fix" – we will have to live through (and endure) all the mess of human joy and suffering. The Lord is clear too that we have to be aware of the personal cost of belonging to him. It is worth noting where the Gospel passage starts – in the material beauty of the Temple – and where it ends – something far more precious will be saved: our lives.

Many thanks to those who braved the elements last Sunday afternoon to gather in Accrington Cemetery and to pray for those who have gone before us. In the end the weather proved to be quite kind on us.
