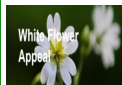

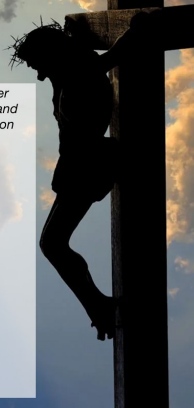

Father's Musings

Back in the 60s some groups “adopted” Jesus Christ as an icon of rebellion, overturn-

ing authority and tearing up the rule book – possibly because of the frequent confrontations between Our Lord and the Pharisees. Today's Gospel, however, shows us Jesus not as rule-breaker, but as rule-fulfiller, bringing an even greater depth to the rule that had guided the people of Israel for centuries. Jesus does not throw out the rulebook – or as the first reading says, He does not command us to be godless! He challenges us in this Gospel to see how far our keeping God's Law will go: will it just be about the letter of the Law (“I have never killed anyone”), or will it look deeper (“Have I ever been angry? Have I been violent in my thoughts?”). The challenge of the Kingdom of Heaven is to keep the commandments first and foremost from within, so that our outward behaviour conforms to the requirements of God's Law.

It's been a relatively quiet week this week with the usual round of parish life ticking away gently.

Wednesday was the great Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes - a feast and a place close to my heart. I went out to Hebden Bridge in search of a few husks for my belly and something to lubricate my throat to celebrate. Why does it always rain when I go to Hebden Bridge?

On Thursday nearly all the clergy of the diocese gathered at the Village Hotel in Bury to hear the feedback of the 1-2-1 sessions that we have had with our facilitator. There was good atmosphere at the meeting as we were able to share as a whole presbyterate in communion with our Bishop our joys and sorrows of priestly life, our hopes and aspirations for the future and how best, as priests, we can sustain and encourage each other. As Bishop John reminds us 'no one understands a priest like another priest.' With the numbers of priests dwindling it is important that there is care and support for the priests who are still have in active ministry. In this regard lay people should step up and take on tasks in the parishes to support their priests rather than just leaving it to Father.

Remember in your prayers Ruth and Jordan who are to be married at St Anne's on Tuesday this week. We wish them every blessing.

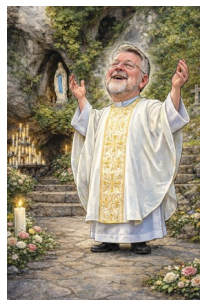


SAVE THE DATE - 30th APRIL 6:30pm for 7:00pm
