Father's Musings

Last week we heard Saint Matthew describing the beginnings of Jesus' public ministry. This week Saint Matthew begins the most important summary of the proclamation of the kingdom of God – what we refer to as the “Sermon on the Mount.” This great collection of Jesus' teachings begins with the Beatitudes – the Charter of the Kingdom. It is essential to understand these, if we are to understand what we will read in Saint Matthew during the rest of this year: the key, as underlined by the First Reading, is that the values of this world are not the values of the Kingdom of God – the Kingdom will see things turned upside down: happiness and blessing belong to those whom this world would ignore or mistreat. If we truly wish to live out the Gospel, we would do well to reflect on the virtues laid out in this familiar passage.



Eeeee I've been double glazed!!! After much toing and froing between myself and the diocese I finally received permission to replace windows in the presbytery. During the week the old, wooden and in some cases, rotten single glazed windows have been replaced with lovely double glazed units. I can immediately feel the benefits as I don't have huge draughts coming into the presbytery. That should help keep the place a bit warmer and hopefully cut down on heating bills.

On Wednesday and Thursday I had the joy and privilege of being present at St Mary's, Burnley for the visit of the Relics of St Carlo Acutis. The church saw a steady flow of the faithful who came to venerate the relics and bring their petitions to St Carlo. There was also the opportunity to go to Confession with priests hearing confessions throughout the two days. This was combined with talks on the life of St Carlo, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and meditated rosary devotions. The Welcome and Farewell Masses of the visit were well attended and I am pleased to say by a lot of young people. At the Welcome Mass I had the task presenting the message of St Carlo to a wider audience by interpreting in Sign Language.
